The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau found that some residential solar lenders build hidden “ dealer fees ” into loans, often increasing costs by 30% or more above the cash. In the world of solar panels, this may look like a person pressuring you into signing a contract you have not thoroughly reviewed or agreeing to a financing plan that has not been entirely laid out. Resist the urge to go solar. Did a salesperson knock on your door and promise free rooftop solar panels at no cost to you?

Or say you'll never have to pay another electricity bill because government programs, grants, or rebates cover your solar installation?

It's likely a scam. It's a very small percentage of rooftop solar companies, but it would be a lie to pretend.sumer complaints about a small number of unscrupulous solar companies. 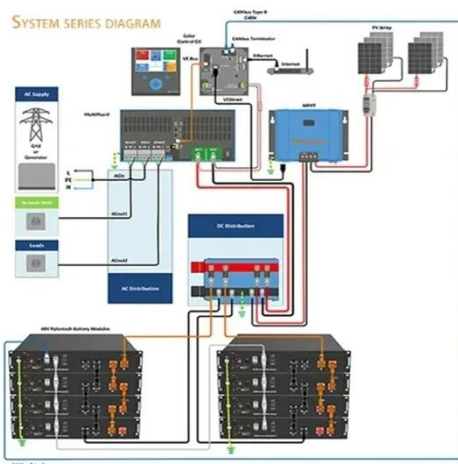
