Energy Poverty Drives Socioeconomic Inequality: Deprivation from energy has far-reaching economic, social, and gender impacts. Sudan produced an average of about 70,000 barrels per day (b/d) of total liquid fuels in 2023, and South Sudan produced an average of about 149,000 b/d. Sudan's total liquid fuels production has steadily and significantly declined over the past decade because upstream exploration and development. Over the last few years, the electricity sector in Sudan has been in a state of crisis: 60 per cent of the Sudanese population have been living without electricity. The chief sources of energy in 2010 were wood and charcoal, hydroelectric power, and oil. [1] Sudan is a net energy exporter.

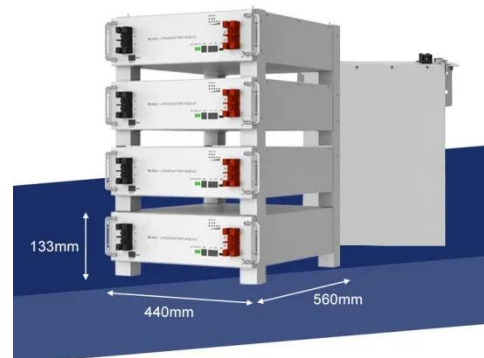
